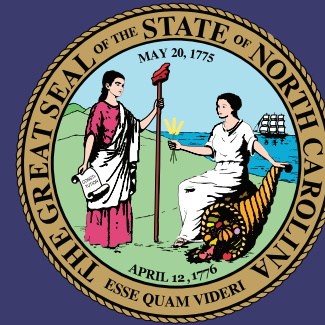

## NC Patriot Star Family RECOVERY Program: American Rescue Plan Funds

The Recovery Scholarship Program is funded through the **American Rescue Plan** with the goal of remediating the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. This federal program allocated monies to North Carolina, which in turn granted funds to Patriot Foundation. It is **a need-based scholarship** that includes specific household income requirements. This program will conclude December 2026.

## NC Patriot STAR Family Program: North Carolina Recurring Funds

The Star Scholarship program is funded annually through the NC Legislature and has the same eligibility criteria as the Recovery Program, except it does not have specific household income requirements.

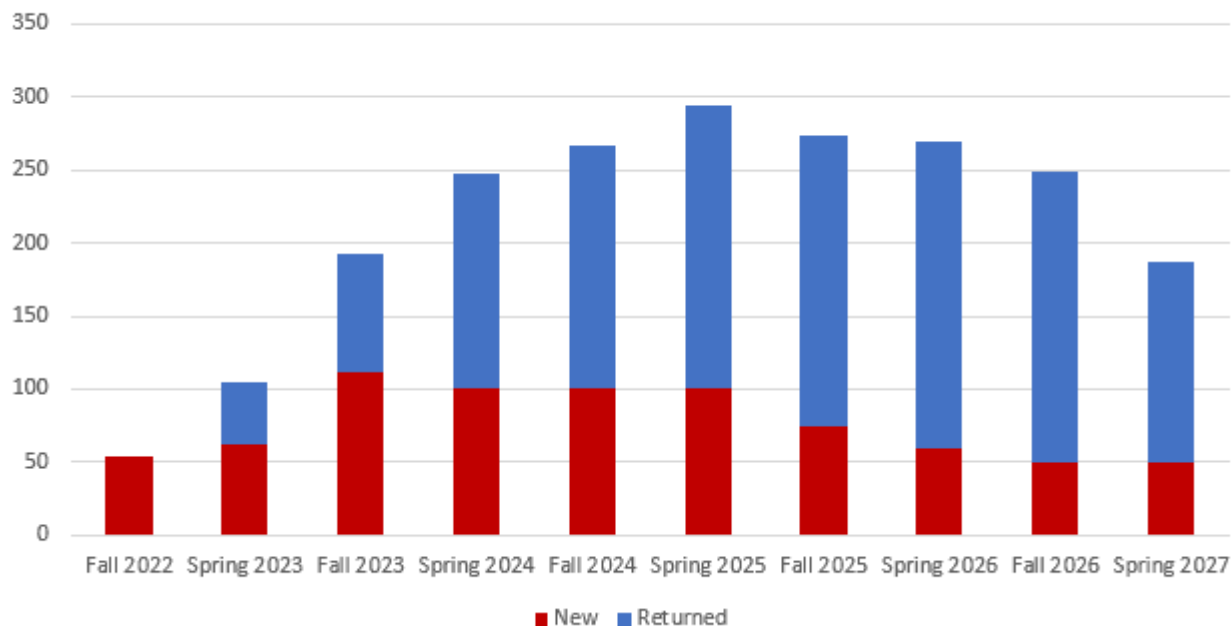


# Having an Impact. For now . . .

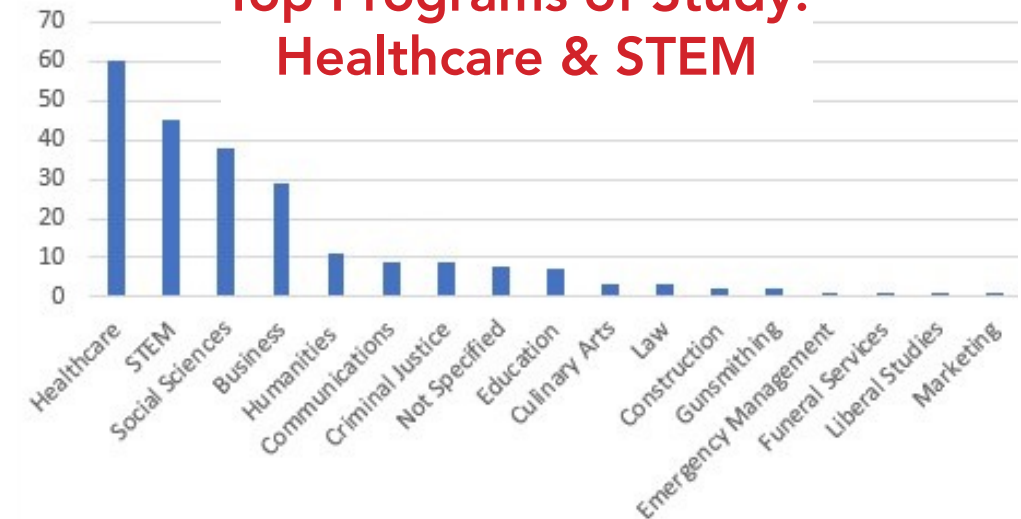


- Minimal funds returned by schools

## Recovery Recipients Top Programs of Study: Healthcare & STEM



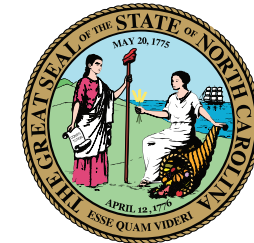

Patriot Foundation was founded in 2003 by Spike and Debbie Smith, with a vision of "Taking Care of Those Left Behind." 9/11 was a recent memory, and the country was in the early years of Operation Iraqi Freedom and the War in Afghanistan.

Initially, a golf tournament was held to benefit soldiers in the Fort Bragg area. Living in the 'shadow of Bragg' meant the Smiths were able to see the need these families faced first-hand. As time went on, the charity grew from the golf tournament into a fully-fledged nonprofit. The idea to raise money and partner with other organizations who are close to the military and veteran populations we serve was the first step in creating the Patriot Foundation it is today.

Slowly, we have grown from focusing only on Fort Bragg (now Fort Liberty), to supporting multiple military installations and services across the country. This growth has been made possible by private individuals, and corporate sponsorships from companies who understand and value the important work we do for the families of wounded, injured, ill, and fallen service members.

Located in Pinehurst NC, Patriot Foundation is a primarily all-volunteer 501(c)(3) non-profit. We are committed to providing post-secondary educational scholarships for the children of servicemen and women killed, wounded, injured, or who have become seriously ill defending our Nation. The best-of-breed non-profit organizations that we support are fully vetted, so we know the funds are going to the people with the most need.

In 2019, Patriot Foundation forged a private / public relationship with the NC Legislature. In 2020, the legislature granted us \$500,000. We successfully awarded scholarships to over 175 students attending North Carolina accredited secondary institutions. This positive experience prompted a perpetual funding \$700,000 recurring monies and a one time grant of \$10,000,000 via the American Rescue Plan.

We are grateful to both the NC Senate and House for seeing the value of Patriot Foundation and supporting our North Carolina military and veteran families.
